DELECTABLE DESIGN

IN MOSS-STITCH
WITH FASCINATING
BANDS OF CROCHET

THE BACK AND FRONT ALIKE

USING No. 11 needles, commence at lower edge by casting on 121 stitches.
1st row—K. 1, then p. 1, k. 1, alt. to end. Repeat this row for 4½ inches. * Next row—K. 2 into first st., knit in m.s. until 1 remains, k. 2 into last st. Knit in m.s. for 1 inch. Repeat from * 6 times more. (135 stitches.) Knit in m.s. until work measures 13 inches. Now shape armholes. Next 2 rows—Cast off 6, knit in m.s. to end. Next 22 rows—K. 2 tog., knit in m.s. to

RIVIERA ●

MATERIALS

Three 100 gramme hanks D.M.C.
Coton Perlé, No. 5.
2 Stratnoid knitting pins, No. 11.
Stratnoid crochet hook, No. 16.

*To obtain the best results
it is essential that you
use the materials exactly
as mentioned above.*

MEASUREMENTS

Shoulder to lower edge, 19½ inches.
round jumper below armholes,
36 inches; sleeve seam, 4 inches.

For abbreviations see page 18.

*Always knit into back of each cast-on
stitch.*

*Tension of knitting, about 7½ stitches
to one inch.*

and (101 stitches.) Knit in m.s. until work measures 17 inches. Cast off.

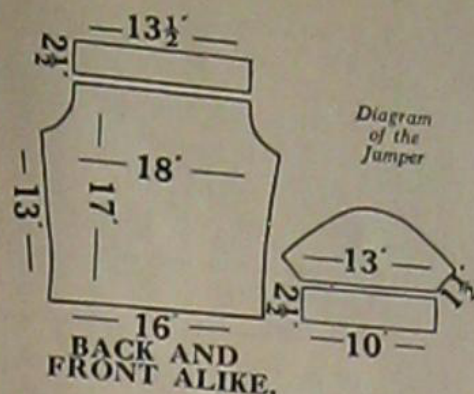
THE SLEEVES (both alike)

Using No. 11 needles, commence at lower edge by casting on 79 stitches.

1st row—K. 1, then p. 1, k. 1, alt. to end.

Next 18 rows—K. 2 into first st., knit in m.s. to end. (97 stitches.) Next row—Knit in m.s. Now shape top. Next 32 rows—K. 2 tog., knit in m.s. to end.

Next 24 rows—K. 2 tog., knit in m.s. until 2 remain, k. 2 tog. (17 stitches.) Cast off.



BACK AND FRONT ALIKE.

9 ch., turn. Now work along one side of rings thus: 1st row—Miss first 4 tr., * 1 s. tr. into next, 2 ch., miss 2 sts., 1 d.c. into next, 2 ch., miss 2 sts., 1 s. tr. into next, 7 ch., miss first 4 sts. of next ring, repeat from * until 1 ring remains, 1 s. tr. into next st., 2 ch., miss 2 sts., 1 d.c. into next, 2 ch., miss 2 sts., 1 s. tr. into next, 4 ch., miss 4 sts., 1 v.l.tr. (thread 3 times over hook) into next st., 3 ch., turn. 2nd row—Miss v.l.tr., then work trebles all along, fasten off. Work along opposite side of rings to correspond. Now make a strip of trebles thus: Commence with a chain same length as insertion, then miss first 3 ch., 1 tr. into every remaining chain, fasten off. Sew insertion and strip of trebles on to a piece of card or stout paper, leaving $\frac{1}{2}$ an

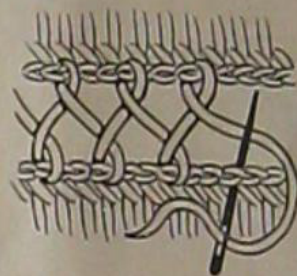
inch space between the two pieces, then faggot-stitch together. Release crochet from card.

THE INSERTION FOR SLEEVES

Work in same way as above, but working 8 rings or 10 inches only.

TO MAKE UP

Pin out each piece to measurements given in diagram, press on wrong side under a damp cloth with a hot iron. Sew insertion to back and front, also lower edge of sleeves. Sew up underarm and sleeve seams. Sew shoulders together at armhole edge for about $1\frac{1}{2}$ inches. Sew in sleeves. Press all seams. For the belt, use a large hook and twelve strands of thread, crochet a chain long enough to go round waist, then two chains, each about 7 inches long. Wind each of the two short chains round and round to form two discs and sew in position. Sew to each end of waist cord. Fasten belt with a press stud.
